




Remove the Stone and Live!



Jesus' Last Words from the Cross

Looking at the four gospels: Matthew, Mark, Luke and John, we get a full picture of what unfolded during Jesus' crucifixion. We know that John the disciple was the only one present at the foot of the cross. Sadly, the other disciples scattered and hid in fear of the Jewish leaders and the Romans who were trying to kill them and put an end to Jesus and His movement.

Jesus' Last Words:

Father forgive them, they know not what they do (Luke 23:34) Today you will be with me in paradise (Lk 23:43) Woman behold your son. Behold your mother (Jn 19:27) I am thirsty (Jn 19:28) Eloi, Eloi, Lama Sabachthani (My God, My God, why hast Thou Forsaken Me?) (Mark 15:34) It is finished (Jn 19:30) Father, into Thy hands I commit My spirit (Luke 23:46)

The very first thing out of Jesus' mouth after they pounded the spikes into His precious hands and feet is *"Father forgive them, they don't know what they're doing"*. How do you respond when someone treats you terribly betrays you or assaults you? Jesus, all God and all man, responds with unconditional forgiveness for being put to death unjustly. In fact, He comes to their defence before His Father and says, don't hold it against them. What lessons can we learn from Jesus?

The soldiers are casting lots for His clothes, the crowds mocking Him and one thief hurling insults at Jesus. Yet the other thief feared God and asked to be remembered and included in His kingdom. Jesus reassures the thief that very day, he would be with Him in paradise. This thief did not have time to be baptized or go through any other religious right-of-passage. He simply believed Jesus was of God, was sorrowful for his sin and in need of a saviour. Simple child-like faith and humility of heart is all that is needed to receive the gift of eternal life because the Lamb of God was being sacrificed on his (and our) behalf. While in agony on the cross, Jesus secures the care of His mother to His disciple. There is no mention of Joseph so we assume Mary is a widow at this point. It was important in that day that a male figure oversees the care of a widow.

"I am thirsty" fulfils the remaining prophecy. Psalm 69:21 David wrote, *"They also gave me gall for my food and for my thirst they gave me vinegar to drink"* in the Greek, this vinegar is translated sour wine. This gall was intended to deaden the senses and lessen the pain.

Jesus and the Father have enjoyed perfect fellowship and now for the very first time, God has turned His back on His Son. The Father poured all of the world's sin upon Jesus on this altar of sacrifice. Imagine the horror of this moment. Scholars have suggested that this was far worse (more than our minds can conceive) than any of the other physical agony. Think of this, the sins of the world dumped onto Jesus, the perfect Son of God, and to be separated from His Father as a result. Truly Jesus was alone!

"It is finished" salvation for mankind has been secured. Sin has been paid for; Jesus took upon Himself the punishment for all sin. Jesus commits His spirit into the Father's hands and gives up the ghost. What chaos. Jesus died between thieves, a few believers, mockers and brutal soldiers gambling for his robe. He was then buried in a borrowed tomb.

Satan may have thought he won in thwarting God's plan of salvation but Sunday was coming! The Father's stamp of approval will be displayed when Jesus rises from the dead; His wrath is satisfied. This is why we celebrate and worship on Sundays; it is the day Jesus defeated death and the grave and rose from the dead.

"Calvary shows how far men will go in sin and how far God will go for man's salvation" H.C. Trumbull. What will you do with Christ's sacrifice on your behalf? It is a free gift but it will not be yours till you by faith accept it and place your trust in Him. For *"whoever calls on the name of the Lord shall be saved*" (Romans 10:13). That is if you confess with your mouth the Lord Jesus and believe in your heart that God has raised Him from the dead, you will be saved. "For with the heart one believes unto righteousness, and with the mouth confession is made unto salvation,"(Romans 10:9-10).
